In this question an intellectual property case study will be read to you.

'Susie' by Calum Trolly (2014) vs 'Sun's Out' by The Pigeons (2016)

**The Case:** Musically, the chorus from 'Sun's Out' by the band The Pigeons had a strong resemblance to the 2014 cult classic 'Susie' composed by Calum Trolly.

Big Tunes Music and Sound Corporation, who own the rights to 'Susie', filed a plagiarism suit against the band for allegedly breaking copyright law. The trial had its court hearing on the 18th February 2018.

**The Outcome:** The judge ruled that plagiarism was indeed evident due to the clear similarity in the melodic line of both choruses. The band were ordered to pay Big Tunes Music and Sound Corporation an undisclosed fee in compensation.
